HAIMS

HEALTH ARTIFACT AND IMAGE MANAGEMENT SOLUTION

The Health Artifact and Image Management Solution (HAIMS) provides the Departments of Defense and Veterans Affairs health care providers global visibility and access to artifacts and images generated during the health care delivery process.

HAIMS is a Wounded Warrior strategic project that provides a single enterprise-wide data sharing capability for all types of artifacts and images (also known as A&I), including radiographs, clinical photographs, electrocardiograph, waveforms, audio files, video and scanned documents.

HAIMS Release I:

Release I provided core functionality of patient search, scanning and uploading of documents, and sharing of radiological Digital Imaging and Communications in Medicine images for visibility and access to A&I. Release I is sustained and integrated into the Release II functionality.

HAIMS Release II:

Release II integrates HAIMS into the AHLTA workflow by making it accessible within AHLTA. It provides: a standards-based interface capability for awareness and access to external A&I repositories, bulk scanning capability with Quality Assurance workflow, ability to associate Garrison and Theater A&I to the EHR, ability to provide or retrieve A&I with the VA, and access to global DoD PACS radiographic images.



Key Features

- ▶ Stores and provides access to A&I
- ▶ Provides global database for registered A&I metadata
- ▶ Provides access to radiographic images in DoD PACS
- ▶ Allows bulk scanning of documents
- ▶ Authenticates Common Access Card
- ▶ Accessible as a standalone system or within AHLTA

Key Benefits

- ▶ Access point for DoD providers to view VA data
- ▶ Population health and medical research for Wounded Warriors
- ▶ Mass scanning for VBA compensation and pension benefits determination
- ▶ Critical component of DoD/VA electronic health record initiative
- ▶ Standards-based interface capability for awareness and access to A&I external repositories

Key Activities

- ▶ Began deployment to DoD enterprise Military Treatment Facilities early 2013
- ▶ Began development of the interface with Veterans Benefits Administration (VBA) in support of the Service Treatment Records (STRs)
