c. Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.

The Draeger Infinity M300 VG2.x_AI (Draeger M300) is a patient-worn transceiver that uses the Infinity Central Station (ICS) as the primary patient monitoring display and primary alarm source. The M300 provides continuous ambulatory monitoring for the following parameters: Electrocardiogram (ECG) including heart rate, arrhythmia, and ST segment analysis. Pulse oximetry including peripheral capillary oxygen saturation (SpO2), pulse plethysmogram waveform, and pulse rate. The Draeger M300 has the following connection ports; ECG lead connector and a SpO2/Aux port. The data is exchanged via two-way wireless communication between the M300 and Infinity Central Station. Internal traffic only on the separate Infinity virtual local area network (VLAN) enclave. The Draeger Infinity M300 communicates with Infinity® Central Station and Infinity® R50N strip recorder. There are no externally connected systems. The hardware components of the system are the Draeger M300 medical device, a bedside charger, a central charger and a programming kit.

The categories of individuals with records in this system are Department of Defense (DoD) health care beneficiaries to include Military members of the Armed Forces, Military retirees, and their family members as well as other categories of individuals eligible to receive medical care at DoD medical treatment facilities.

The Draeger Infinity M300 receives, processes, stores, transmits and displays PII data from both members of the general public and Federal employees. All data is received and transmitted only on the separate Infinity VLAN enclave. The M300 processes physiological patient data without identification. The PII collected: Patient Name, Patient ID, Patient Category, Date of Birth, Admit Date, Gender, and Pacemaker Type.

The Draeger Infinity M300 is owned and operated by the DHA sites who purchase the workstation.

d. Why is the PII collected and/or what is the intended use of the PII? (e.g., verification, identification, authentication, data matching, mission-related use, administrative use)

PII is collected from the Draeger Central Station (ICS) to match patient to the test to be performed. The intended use of the PII is to verify and monitor patient data for continuous patient care.
