This Defense Health Agency-Supplemental Policy Memorandum, based on the authorities of References (a) and (b), and in accordance with the guidance of References (c) through (f), provides clarification guidance on Reference (h).

Reference (h) is not intended to restrict Service Component Commanders from exercising their Title 10 authorities to assign military members to required duties outside of the military medical treatment facility (MTF) such as honor guard, courts-martial member, flag detail, safety officer/non-commissioned officer, key control custodian, etc. However, the dual-hatted Market Director/Service Component Commander must consider the impact on MTF operations and health care delivery before approving such assignments. When military personnel are assigned duties outside of the MTFs on behalf of their respective Service Component Commander, they are constructively removed from DHA authority, direction, and control and have no authority to supervise, direct, control, evaluate, or effect any other aspect of employment of DHA civilian employees.
