Dear Mr. Chairman:

Please find enclosed a report addressing the status of active construction projects for the first three quarters of Fiscal Year (FY) 2018. This report is in response to the Joint Explanatory Statement accompanying the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2018 (Public Law 115–41), which requests the Department to provide quarterly updates on the progress of all hospital construction projects to include any settlements that have been reached for contractor error or project management deficiencies.

The military construction of medical facilities is progressing. The Defense Health Agency and construction agents, including the United States Army Corps of Engineers and Naval Facilities Engineering Command, have provided increased oversight and project management to enhance management of projects in order to limit exposure of both cost and schedule. Since the Committee report was published, five hospitals and clinics completed construction and opened for business; and two commenced construction activities as of June 2018. The enclosed report on the progress of hospital construction projects provides construction timelines, and the current working estimates of active hospital and clinic construction projects for the first three quarters of FY 2018.

Thank you for your interest in the health and well-being of our Service members, veterans, and their families. A similar letter is being sent to the other congressional defense committees.

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DEFENSE HEALTH AGENCY'S HOSPITAL CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM STATUS OF ACTIVE CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The first, second, and third quarter reports are in response to the Joint Explanatory Statement accompanying the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2018, which requests the status of active Medical Military Construction projects. Specifically, the committee requests the Defense Health Agency (DHA) to report to the congressional defense committees "on the progress of all hospital construction projects to include any settlements that have been reached for contractor error or project management deficiencies." The data presented below, as reported by Design and Construction Agents, reflect data submitted with Title 10 U.S. Code § 2851 reports for December 2017, March 2018, and June 2018, representing the first three quarters in fiscal year (FY) 2018. As of the submission of this report, there are 24 active hospital and clinic projects in construction. In addition to active construction projects, there are 22 projects in the design phase as of June 2018.

BACKGROUND

The DHA is responsible for facility life-cycle management of U.S. military medical facilities worldwide, to preserve ready and resilient facilities that sustain military medicine's mission assurance of world-class health care for America's warfighters and their families. These military medical facilities include medical centers, hospitals, ambulatory care centers, medical training facilities, medical research facilities, and veterinary facilities in the Military Health System. In accordance with Title 10 U.S. Code § 2851 and Department of Defense (DoD) Directive 4270.5, military construction of such facilities is to be carried out under the direction and supervision of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and Naval Facilities Engineering as the Construction Agent for the current active projects identified in this report. Therefore, data herein corresponds with that provided by the Construction Agents. Title 10 U.S. Code § 2851 further requires reporting project data at a frequency no less than once a month, which provides a foundation for information within this report.

RESULTS

Current Status of Active Construction Projects

The active hospital and clinic projects in construction identified in this report include projects that have been awarded through projects that reached substantial completion and are in transition. The status, including a construction timeline and current working estimate of the active hospital and clinic projects in construction, is included in Tables 1, 2, and 3, representing the first, second, and third quarters respectively. Other projects reported in the 2851 include projects that are complete and waiting for financial closeout by the Construction Agents. During the first quarter of FY 2018, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers completed a settlement of Request for Equitable Adjustment on the Hospital Replacement at Fort Bliss, TX (PN 72481, contract W9126G-13-C-0004), at a value of \$133,638,191, related to time impacts that arose on or before May 31, 2016, for which no contract errors are attributed. Of this equitable adjustment, 9.5 percent included costs associated with a delay of 306 calendar days, for which a DoD Inspector General report, dated June 06, 2018, attributed 126 days to project management. No

other settlements were reached for contractor error or project management deficiencies during the second or third quarters of FY 2018.
