# Amputation Care ECHO (Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes)

#### What is ECHO

Amputation Care ECHO is a hub and spoke educational telementoring model that links expert specialist teams at a 'hub' with clinicians at other locations – the 'spokes' of the model. Together, they participate in monthly ECHO sessions to learn new material and discuss patient care. Each Amputation Care ECHO event contains a short didactic presentation related to amputation care followed by case presentations. Hub specialists serve as mentors and colleagues, sharing their medical knowledge and expertise with clinicians new to amputation or those who do not work with amputation on a routine basis. ECHO creates ongoing learning communities where "spoke" clinicians receive support and develop the skills they need to treat a particular condition. As a result, clinicians can provide comprehensive, best-practice care to patients with complex health conditions right where they live.

# **Purpose Statement**

Amputation Care ECHO strives to:

- a. Use technology (multipoint videoconferencing and audio conferencing) to leverage scarce resources and create knowledge networks. A multidisciplinary team of experts located at the hub is connected with learners at spoke sites on regularly scheduled, monthly Amputation Care ECHO sessions.
- b. Improve outcomes by reducing variations in processes of care and sharing of best practices and expertise.
- c. Utilize case-based learning: guided practice through diverse, real-life cases with subject matter experts to facilitate learning by doing and creating learning loops. Over time, these learning loops create deep knowledge, skills and self-efficacy.

#### **Target Audience**

Health care professionals including physicians, occupational therapists, nurses, physical therapists and other clinical staff including, researchers, orthotists and prosthetists.
