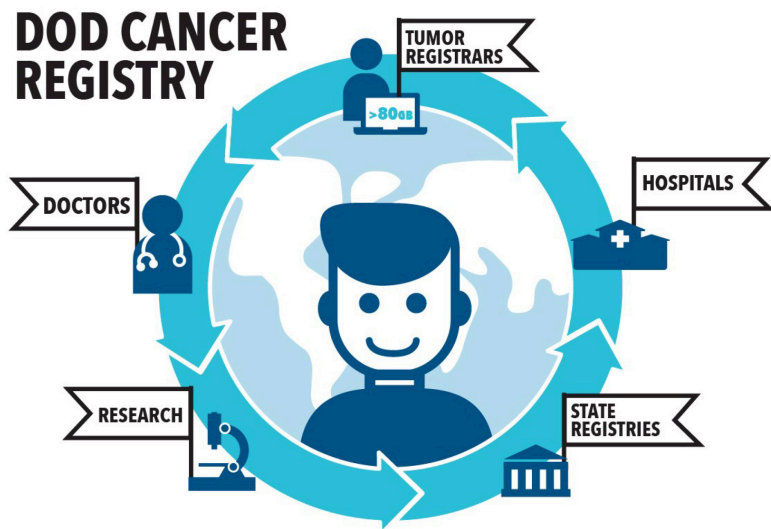


The DOD CR is a data application and repository supporting the Military Health System's cancer treatment and research. This centralized database facilitates patient-centered, evidence-based health care.

DOD CR is a Business Acquisition Category (BCAT) program that serves military hospitals and clinics, as well as DOD Commission on Cancer-accredited centers around the world. This registry ensures that the MHS is compliant with federal regulations in tracking tumors and cancers for beneficiaries throughout their lifetime. It allows researchers to access high-quality, standardized data for cancer studies, treatment effectiveness, and evidence-based interventions.

Background:

The DOD CR was championed through a modernization effort led by the Deputy Assistant Director for Medical Affairs and transitioned to an industry-wide, Commercial-off-the-Shelf solution in 2019. The Solution Delivery Division Health Services Support Program Management Office was tasked with implementing and fielding the COTS solution across the enterprise.
