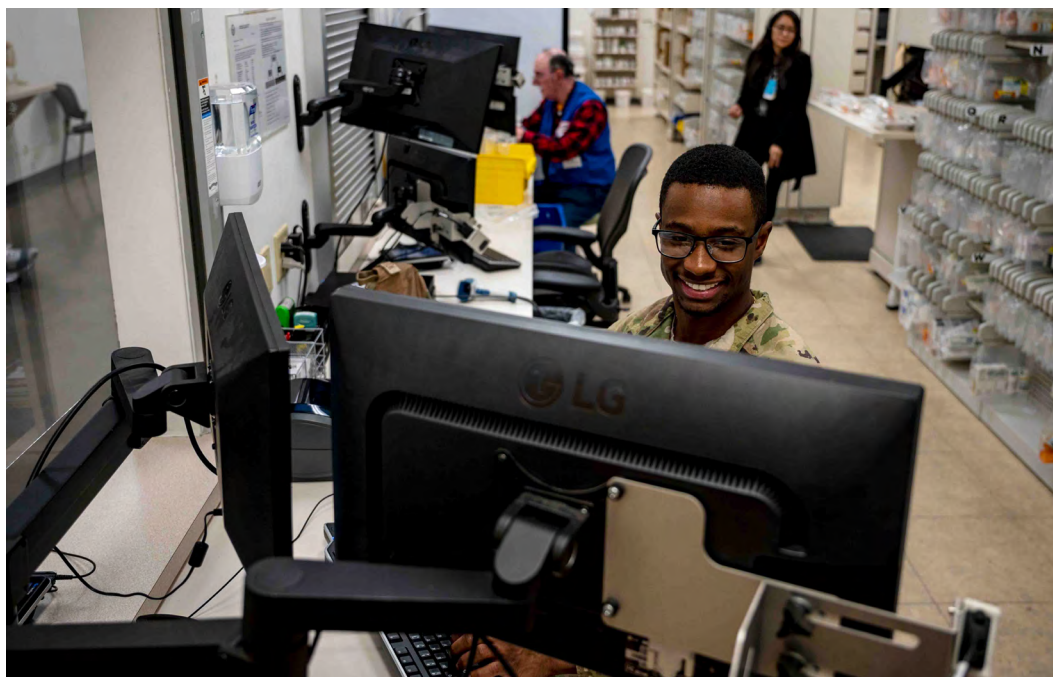


The Composite Health Care System allows clinicians and Department of Defense providers to effectively manage clinical services and health care for over 9.5 million beneficiaries.

CHCS provides business functions for 106 host sites, supporting more than 500 military hospitals and clinics and 150,000 health care providers. It enables electronic scheduling of patient appointments, documentation of health information and history, ordering of laboratory and radiology tests, retrieval of test results, and medication prescription entry. The Computerized Physician Order Entry function safeguards beneficiary care by identifying illegible orders and reducing the risk of inappropriate drug interactions.

On June 21, 2013, an Acquisition Decision Memorandum was signed by the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology and Logistics, outlining the decision to pursue MHS GENESIS as a replacement for DOD legacy clinical systems. CHCS is included in the list of legacy systems identified for replacement. CHCS will be officially decommissioned on June 30, 2025.
