c. Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.

MagView Mammography Information System (MMIS) is a commercial-off-the-shelf (COTS) product. The Magview information software is an automated workflow efficiency tool used for mammography practice. The software aims to improve patient intake, patient follow up and tracking, technologist workflow, patient exam, radiologist reporting, outcomes in accuracy and tracking. The program allows all patient information to be housed and available in one system, allowing the staff user to have access to all details during any stage of the workflow. The Mammography Information Management System allows users to automate reporting, tracking, notification, recall, and quality assurance (QA) functions for breast imaging patients.

Additionally, this solution creates QA reports consistent with the Mammography Quality Standards Act (MQSA). MMIS does not utilize any mobile applications. Clinical and Administrative information is transmitted to the MMIS Application Server via HL7 from the AGFA Connectivity Manager.

Personally Identifiable information (PII) and protected health information (PHI) are accessible only by clinicians who have the capability to generate hard copy reports and images containing private data as well as transmit and receive private data via a wired network connection. Patient PII is received through the HL7 message received from the composite health care system (CHCS) and is encrypted in the database. All access to the system is managed, overseen, and monitored by the system administrator (Radiology PACS Team). Identifier types collected by MMIS include the individual's demographic and medical information.

The PII is from general public, such as, Armed Forces members, family members, retirees, and patients eligible for care.

MagView Mammography Information System is DHA owned and operated.

d. Why is the PII collected and/or what is the intended use of the PII? (e.g., verification, identification, authentication, data matching, mission-related use, administrative use)

PII is collected for the purposes of patient identification. The intended use of PII is to distinguish, track, and deliver timely and effective patient care. In addition, intended uses of PII include treatment, payment, and healthcare operations.
