SUBJECT: Exception to Policy for Anthrax Vaccination of Forwarded Deployed Naval Forces (FDNF) and III Marine Expeditionary Force (III MEF) in the Resumption of the Anthrax Vaccination Program (AVIP) under the Emergency Use Authorization (EUA)

- I request you approve an exception to policy request for Forward Deployed Naval Forces (FDNF) and III Marine Expeditionary Force (III MEF) under the Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) for AVIP.
- Your April 29, 2005, implementation memo requires the Chairman, Joint Chiefs of Staff (or designee) recommend for your approval additional personnel not authorized in that memo for inclusion in the AVIP under the EUA.
- The exception to policy request from the Assistant Secretary of the Navy (Manpower and Reserve Affairs) (TAB B), with concurrence of the Director Joint Staff (TAB C), satisfies the requirements in the April 29, 2005, implementation memo.
- I agree that their rationale is sound and should be supported.

RECOMMENDATION: That the USD (P&R) sign the memo at TAB A.
