## Update: Deployment Health Assessments, U.S. Armed Forces, December 2016


Since January 2003, pronounced fluctuations in the monthly numbers of pre- and post-deployment health assessment forms transmitted to the Armed Forces Health Surveillance Branch generally have corresponded to times of departure and return of large numbers of service members who deployed. Between April 2006 and November 2016, the number of post-deployment health reassessment (PDHRA) forms per month ranged from 5,612 to 36,863 (Figure 1). During the past 12 months (December 2015–November 2016), numbers of post-deployment health assessment and reassessment forms per month have been relatively stable (Figure 1, Table 1). The rolling one-year averages for monthly numbers of pre-deployment and post-deployment health reassessments for the most recent 12-month period were the 12 lowest averages after January 2004 and August 2006, respectively (data not shown). For the purposes of this report about service members' responses to the assessment questions, it is important to note that the denominator is the total number of service members who completed deployment-related assessments, not the total number of service members eligible for the assessments.

During the past 12 months, the percentages of total returned deployers who rated their health as either "fair" or "poor" ranged from 6.0%–7.7% on post-deployment health assessment questionnaires and 6.5%–8.9% on PDHRA questionnaires (**Figure 2**). The percentages of total service members who rated their health as either "fair" or "poor" on the pre-deployment questionnaires during this period varied between 3.3% and 4.3%.

In general, the percentages of reserve component members reporting "health concerns" and "exposure concerns" on post-deployment assessments and reassessments have been higher than among active component members (Table 2, Figure 3). Compared to their respective counterparts, service members in the active component of the Marine Corps and reserve component of the Army were more likely to report exposure concerns 3–6 months after deployment than at the time of return from deployment (Table 2).

At the time of return from deployment, 16.1% of active component and 15.1% of reserve component service members reported any depression symptoms. Service members in the active and reserve components were about five and thirteen times as likely, respectively, to receive a mental health referral at the time of the PDHRA compared to the time of return from deployment. Moreover, at the time of the PDHRA (3-6 months after return), reservists were more than twice as likely to receive a mental health referral as members of the active component (Table 2).

Figure 1. Numbers of deployment health assessment and reassessment forms, by month, U.S. Armed Forces, January 2003–November 2016




