Defense Health Program Quarterly Budget Execution Fourth Quarter, FY 2016

**Issue:** As requested by the Joint Explanatory Statement, accompanying the Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2016 (Public Law 114-113), the fourth quarter fiscal year (FY) 2016 budget execution data for all Defense Health Program Activities is below.

## **Report Request:**

Requests the Assistant Secretary of Defense (Health Affairs) to provide quarterly reports to the congressional defense committees on budget execution data for all of the Defense Health Program budget activities.

**Summary:** The cumulative fourth quarter Operation and Maintenance budget execution rate is 99.54 percent.

Note: The enacted amount for the FY 2016 Defense Health Program Operation and Maintenance Private Sector Care Budget Activity Group, \$14,525.137 million, includes an additional \$137.735 million approved in the FY 16-22 PA (OMNIBUS) to sustain the delivery of health care services to beneficiaries through September.
