Bottom Line Up Front

- The Cosmetic Surgery Estimator (CSE) version 18 has been implemented as a web application: https://ubocse.org
- Some reasons why the CSE web application was created include:
 - Update the CSE application using current technology
 - Refresh the look and feel to something more modernized
 - Improve configuration control and maintenance
 - Overcome issues introduced with the Med365 Office migration





Implementation Comparisons and Impacts


Comparison	MS Access	Web-Based
Platform	32 or 64-bit MS Access database	Web based application compatible with Edge, Chrome, and Firefox
How to get the application	Download ZIP file from website; extract to local or network drive to execute	Browse to the application URL and login; no downloads required
Version control	Challenging to prevent users from using old versions of the CSE (could be using outdated rates)	Managed internally; All users use the same version
Exposure to application errors due to MS Access updates	Minimal, but updates have required maintenance requiring users to manually download corrected versions	Bug fixes, when required, are immediately available to all users
Login information	User ID is the user's DMIS ID and same password for all users	User ID is the user's health.mil address, passwords are user specific; updates sent to all users more efficiently










User Interface is Similar
